What you already know

Gender diverse organisations:

Make more money

- Gender-diverse boards generate a higher return on equity (4% greater ROE)
- Investors in companies with strong gender diversity strategies receive excess returns running at a compound annual growth rate of 3.3%
- Companies where women made up at least 15% of senior managers had >50% higher profitability than those where female representation was <10%

Make better decisions

 High-performing companies report that men and women have equal influence on strategy development

Perform better in hard times

• Gender-diverse boards outperform in terms of share price performance during times of crisis or volatility

- Started in 2017
- >150 members
- First ever women in geothermal session at Latin American Energy conference, Aug 2018
- Workshops and training to empower their women

El Salvador

How men can have a positive impact on the inclusion of women

- Commercial coffee and cacao operation that employs 600 local women. Uses the cooling tower condensate from Berlín geothermal power plant to water plants
- Wider reforestation program 3,000 people employed (70% women) to plant 6 million trees
- Empowers women in geothermal power plants to perform activities traditionally performed by men. Female participation in geothermal plants has grown by 20% since his arrival
- Sought to sign an agreement with El Salvador's Ministry of Education to support WING women who have not finished high school
- Created specialized nurseries for the children of LaGeo employees
